

What does UNCRC stand for?

The United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child



The UNCRC sets out the human rights of every person under the age of 18.

The Convention has 54 articles that cover all aspects of a child's life and set out the civil, political, economic, social and cultural rights that all children everywhere are entitled to.

It also explains how adults and governments must work together to make sure all children can enjoy all their rights.

Every child has rights, whatever their ethnicity, gender, religion, language, abilities or any other status.



ABCDE of Your Rights



A: UNIVERSAL. Rights are for ALL children.

B: INHERENT. Rights are there at BIRTH.

C: INALIENABLE. Rights CANNOT be taken away.

D: UNCONDITIONAL. Rights DON'T have to be earned.

E: INDIVISIBLE. All rights are EQUALLY important.






What is a Rights Respecting school?
